### From the rotten roots of folklore, Akkajee emerges with a new thematic album in April

**Akkajee**, the headstrong rascal of the Finnish folk music scene, releases their second album *Lastenkerääjä* on April 18, 2021. Presumably the world's only duo to bring together the nyckelharpa, the viola and vocals has extended its instrumental repertoire with a whole load of junk in the form of self-made "instruments". The musical potion that has been simmering for seven magical years immerses its listeners in Finnish folktales as well as transcendental string noise.

The thematic album, aptly named *Child Collector* in Finnish, is centred on the mind of a child. The difference between what is real and what is imagined is fickle in the impulsive actions and experiences of the young. Beliefs, memories and fears together with child's play and magical practices all blend in through capricious and whimsical ways as the imagination races to the unknown.

*"Exploring the mindscape of a child through music felt novel, and the sounds of our childhood, varying from the hum of a cassette player to the jingling of music boxes, inspired us to venture into different directions. At first, childhood felt a little light for a theme, but we soon found that many songs reflected on death or at least the fear of it,"* nyckelharpist [Meriheini Luoto](#) explains.

The many stories told give the album layers and a wealth of voices: the old codger collecting naughty children in a sack, wicked spirits keeping infants awake at night, and the young mother giving birth with the help of both ritualistic magic and the Holy Mary are some of the tales and themes that the songs explore.

*“We were initially studying folktales in the archives, but over the years our relationship with them has changed and stretched out to new heights. There’s a level of oblivion that ties together with boisterous imaginations in a way that we could not have achieved in a short period of time. I don’t think that this album took seven years to ripen for nothing. After all, the number seven is the symbol of perfection and completeness,”* the duo’s violist [Iida Savolainen](#) notes.
